Africa CDC Likely to Declare Mpox Public Health Emergency Next Week

KINSHASA (Reuters) – Africa's public health agency is set to declare an mpox emergency as early as next week, saying the viral infection's rate of spread is alarming, as a new variant moves across Democratic Republic of Congo's borders. Mpox is transmitted through close contact and causes flu-like symptoms and pus-filled lesions. Most cases are mild but it can kill.

CAVSNET is based out of the University of Minnesota and modeled after the successful Small Animal Veterinary Surveillance Network (SAVSNET) at the University of Liverpool. CAVSNET aims to collect data from small animals and equines. The CAVSNET Team participates in the University of Minnesota Antimicrobial Resistance and Stewardship Initiative (ARSI). ARSI provides high-quality and evidence-based resources
